Read the following passage carefully and answer questions 18 to 24.

The Emperor Penguin is the only animal to live in Antarctica during winter. They have wings but unlike most birds, they are unable to fly.

Every winter, Emperor Penguins travel across the ice to find a good place to lay their eggs. The males arrive first. In May or June, the females will lay an egg each and pass the egg to the males to keep it warm. Then the females will leave their nests to search for food.

The male Emperor Penguins must create a safe and warm environment for the eggs using their own bodies. They will balance the eggs on their feet and cover them with a warm layer of feathers called a brood pouch.

The male Emperor Penguins must also cope with harsh weather conditions while having nothing to eat for months. They huddle together in groups to keep themselves warm and to protect their eggs from the strong winds and snow storms.

When the female Emperor Penguins return to the nesting site, the eggs would have hatched. They will start to feed their chicks. At this time, the male Emperor Penguins will return to sea to fish while the females continue to care for the chicks.

By December, the weather in Antarctica becomes warmer and the outer ice surface breaks up. Now, the young penguins are ready to swim and fish on their own.
