Village under water

Tuesday, 23 December 2004 By Joanne Pitt

When she should have been asleep in bed last night in Semarang, Indonesia, Yatini was knee deep in water in her bedroom. She had spent the night moving her belongings to the safety of the upper floor of her house. At 5 a.m., the water from the flooded River Kendal started to seep over the tops of her boots. At that point, she gave up.

"I'm feeling very tired," she said wearily. "I haven't slept for the whole night. This is our third flood in the last six months. I don't think I can take it anymore!" Yatini went to join her neighbours in the shelter of the village hall.

"This is a dangerous time for the very young and the very old because many diseases are water-borne," said Dr Lydia Hanes, the village doctor. She added that muddy river water when mingled with water from drains, was particularly dangerous. She warned, "People should boil all their drinking water, or only drink bottled water."

Another casualty is the village school. They still do not know the extent of the damage but it is expected that the school will be closed for two months.

Reverend Jabez, whose church is on the highest point in the village, has opened up the church hall as a place of refuge. Now, the hall is swarmed with hundreds of homeless villagers. Reverend Jabez and his wife, Sarah, have been busy preparing hot drinks and food for the people.

"I'm glad we are able to help the villagers in bad times like these," said Sarah.
