The Dodo bird was first seen around 1600 on the Mauritius island. However, it became extinct less than eighty years later. Presently, the only known and most complete skeleton of the Dodo bird is exhibited in a museum in America and no other parts of the world.

Based on the remains of the Dodo bird, many scientists believe it was 5
about a metre tall and weighed about twenty kilogrammes. Moreover, the Dodo
bird had heavy and stubby wings, suggesting that it was flightless. Despite this,
scientists believe the Dodo bird used to be able to fly once upon a time. It was
also believed that when the ancestors of the Dodo bird landed on Mauritius, they 10
found a habitat with plenty of food and no predators. Therefore, they did not need
to fly and they even built their nests on the ground. This caused the Dodo bird to
evolve into a flightless one eventually.

Some scientists think that the destruction of the forest and the arrival of the
sailors from Holland on the Mauritius island had caused the Dodo bird to become 15
extinct. Being fearless of people and not able to fly made it easy prey for humans.
At the same time, the animals that the Dutch sailors brought with them such as
the dogs and pigs also destroyed the nests of the Dodo birds and prevented the
birds from reproducing.

It was observed that soon after the Dodo bird became extinct, the Mauritius
tree stopped sprouting seeds. The Dodo bird used to eat the fruit of this tree and 20
the seeds could only grow after passing through its digestive tract. Hence, it is
also known as the Dodo tree. However, with the extinction of the Dodo bird, the
Dodo tree could no longer reproduce. Fortunately, some people discovered that
turkeys could also help the seeds grow. Thus, they used the turkeys to begin a
new generation of the tree. This **saved the Dodo tree from following in the** 25
Dodo bird's footsteps.

Mr Ranjit Singh shouted for help till he was hoarse but nobody was around at that time. The snatch thief made a quick getaway and sold the victim's Nokia cell phone for \$100. Mr Singh never recovered his cell phone.

The police officer, Mr David Tan, commended the two members of the public for their public-spirited act and vigilance that helped the police nab the snatch thief. He said, "This highlights how important it is for the members of the public to work closely with the police. It is crucial to ensuring a safe and secure community in Singapore."

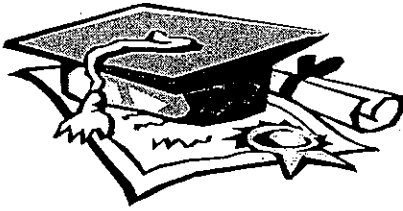

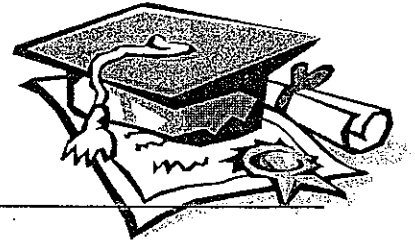
