Abandoned at birth, Olivia Lum was adopted by a widow. As a child, Olivia lived in an old hut with bare earth for its floor. When she was nine, she had to earn money to support herself and her foster mother because her foster mother was too old to work.

Even though she was faced with many difficulties, Olivia did very well in school. One of her teachers suggested that she move to Singapore, from Malaysia, where there would be better chances. She did so when she was 15, with just \$10 in her pocket. She supported herself through school and university by taking on many part-time jobs. At first, Olivia employed only two people - a technician and a clerk. She would travel up to Malaysia on a motorcycle to sell her products. By 2012, the company had earned around \$680 million.
