Madam Ng Moey Chye's job was to carry bricks at a construction site. She would wake up at dawn and walk from her home at Chinatown to Collyer Quay where she worked. Her job was hard and tiring but it was the only work she could do.

Madam Ng was born in Singapore in 1932. She was adopted when she was young and her adoptive parents never sent her to school. As an adult, Madam Ng could not find a job. So she decided to work hard as a Samsui woman.

Like most Samsui women in Singapore, Madam Ng did not get married because she was beyond the ideal age of marriage by the time she started work. She supported herself by working at construction sites. She also wore a bright red headscarf or 'hong toujin'.

Today, at 85 years old, Madam Ng is retired and lives in a flat in Redhill. She is still hale and hearty and does not let her age slow her down. She earns money by selling used cardboard.

Once a week, she goes to the Apex Club of Singapore where she receives a food package. Although she lives a simple life now, she chooses to see the brighter side of her situation. She is grateful for her good health and the young volunteers at the Apex Club.
