The Norwegian grandmaster was in New York for a week to run a chess camp.

Carlsen spent the next hour replaying one of his games from memory. He asked the audience at certain points of his demonstration to figure out what the next move might have been. The audience racked their brains trying to figure out 10 Carlsen's next move, while he sipped on his cup of coffee.

What was amazing was that Carlsen was able to remember every single chess move he had ever made. It was an astonishing feat, considering he had played more than 10,000 matches. He was also able to demonstrate to the audience alternative moves that a player might have taken to win the match.

When asked if he was shocked by a bold move by his opponent, Carisen grinned and said, "Well, I would have seen it when I made my move."

When someone suggested a move that might lead to a draw, Carlsen chided him, "We are playing to win, not survive!"
