Every good climber wants to climb Mount Everest which is 8 848 metres above sea level and the highest mountain in the world. It stands between Nepal and Tibet, in the Himalayas. It is in fact quite a "young" mountain, only about two million years old. The Tibetans call it *Chomolungma*, "The Mother of the World."

By 2004, more than 2 000 people have climbed to the top of Mount Everest. You cannot climb the mountain without special permission from the government of Nepal. You can only climb it in May or October every year and you must have a booking for your expedition. At the moment, there are no more bookings available for the next ten years!

Mountain climbers who have climbed Mount Everest used tents, oxygen bottles and other climbing equipment. Many have left their old equipment behind. According to some estimates, more than 50 tons of non-biodegradable trash was abandoned on the mountain between the 1950s and the mid-1990s. Littering is now a serious problem high up on the mountain.

The government of Nepal has taken steps toward protecting Mount Everest. Thanks to a 1992 taw, if climbers leave any non-biodegradable trash such as plastic containers on the mountain, they lose a \$4,000 pre-expedition deposit. Expedition teams must bring down the same amount of gear and supplies that they took up.

Although more people are climbing Mount Everest, modern equipment and professional expertise cannot eliminate the challenge or the difficulties. Climbing Mount Everest remains, to this day, a formidable challenge as climbers continue to push the limits of human endurance.
