

Section H - Comprehension Open-ended (5 x 2 marks)
Read the passage carefully and answer the questions that follow. Write your answers in complete sentences.

Global warming does not necessarily mean that all places are affected by rising temperature. Some places can get colder than before. Others may get wetter or drier. The world climate is a "system", meaning that things are all connected.

Scientists say that the climate change that is happening now is not natural. Human beings cause the climate change problem which only humans can fix. Therefore, it is important for people to act upon it now.

Human activity causes the air to contain a lot more carbon dioxide than before.

Carbon dioxide is produced when fuel is burnt in car engines, factories and power stations. Cutting down forests also increases the carbon dioxide levels in the atmosphere because the trees are not available to absorb carbon dioxide for photosynthesis.

The problem with carbon dioxide is that it is a "greenhouse gas". It has a special property that turns the atmosphere into a giant blanket that traps some of the sun's heat. Greenhouse gases are needed to keep the Earth warm enough for life. However, the oceans start heating up when there is an excessive amount of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere.

When oceans heat up even by just a few degrees, ice in the polar regions melts. This causes rising sea levels which can become problems for small islands and cities near the sea.

Singapore's Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong warned, "If we do not do anything to fix this problem, ecosystems and human societies could experience-major disruptions over the next 50 to 100 years and quite possibly sooner." However, reducing carbon dioxide emissions requires big changes to the way people live.
