





Anna also shared a few heartwarming examples of positive changes in the children. In the beginning, many parents were unsure about The Fun Factory Programme. However, they soon 15 experienced for themselves how their children became more polite, sociable, considerate and helpful after the classes. They then knew that they had made the right decision.
