The white reindeer was photographed when Mr Nordsveen and his friend, Mr Olsen, went on a hiking trip in the mountains. The photographs show it blending into the snow, with the animal's piercing eyes and darker-coloured antlers contrasting sharply with the rest of the picture.

Mr Nordsveen told reporters of Caters News, "I was hiking when I saw this wonderful little creature. He looked at me straight in the eyes. Like a curious explorer, it moved towards me in a relaxed manner." The mother of the young reindeer was apparently among some trees behind. The photographer also told ABC News, "The local Sami people we talked to told us that these white animals are so unique that in Sami tradition they are thought to bring happiness." Mr Nordsveen also mentioned to Caters News that white reindeer have an uncommon genetic mutation that strips their fur of pigment to allow them to blend into their snowy surroundings. They are not albinos as their eyes and their antlers are still dark coloured.

After a football practice, twelve school boys and their football coach went missing in the caves of northern Thailand when a monsoon downpour flooded their way out. Worry gripped the nation as news bulletins erupted with news of an excursion-turned-disaster.

With the help of thousands of security personnel, medics, world-class cave divers and volunteers, the rescue operation was a success. Many people were astonished to see all the survivors so lively and carefree in their first public appearance after being discharged from hospital. Sporting colourful football jerseys, the boys did not look like they were affected by the terrifying ordeal. On the contrary, they were all smiles in front of hundreds of journalists as they recounted their near-death experience.

"I was dizzy, weak and starving," said the youngest one, 11-year-old Chanin. "I tried not to think of food, like fried rice, because it'd make me even hungrier." The media roared with laughter.

It is hard to fathom how the team managed to keep up the courage and will to survive in the face of likely death. Their first-hand accounts revealed vivid details of being trapped in the narrow and dark underground tunnels. They encouraged one other and would not let pessimism seep in.

Before they were found by British cavers John Volanthen and Richard Stanton, the stranded team had spent nine days in the dark without food. The boys would take turns digging holes in the cave wall with pieces of rock, in a bid to escape. Before beginning the daily toil, each of them would fill their empty stomach with water. All they could consume was water that trickled down stalactites and the floodwater that trapped them. They were starved and anxious as hope of going home began to drift away.
