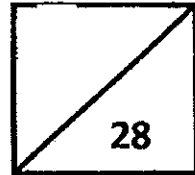

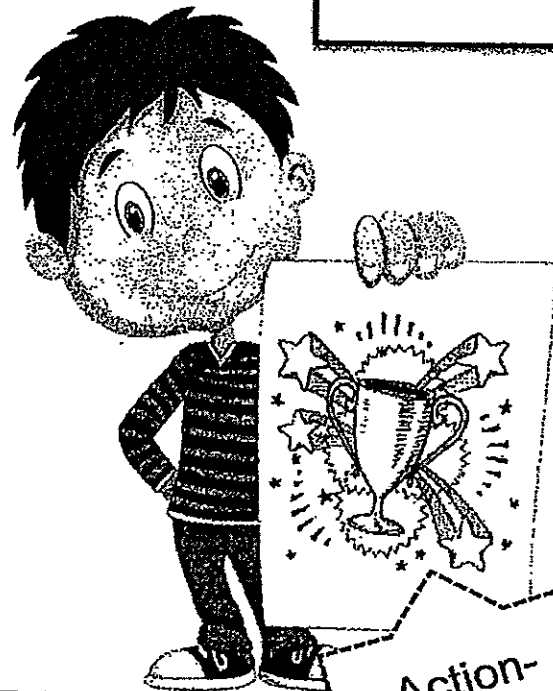

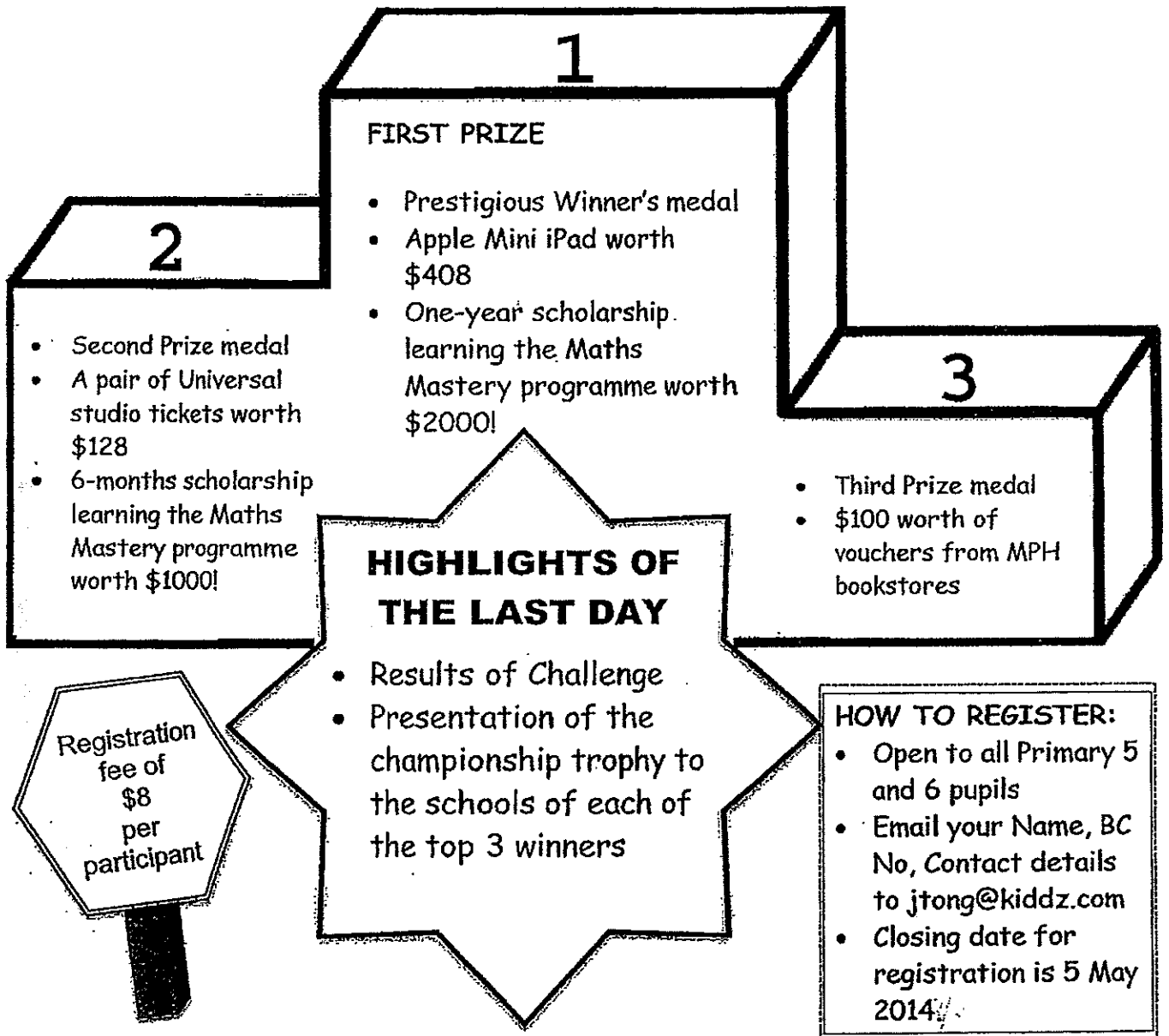

"Singapore's Mass Rapid Transit (SMRT) system is more reliable nowadays. There are fewer delays (29)_____ huge sums are being spent to maintain and improve the network," said Transport Minister Lui Tuck Yew. (30)_____ he acknowledged that SMRT could have done "much better" in handling the three breakdowns last month, especially in providing timely information on the situation to commuters.

Mr Lui said the SMRT and Land Transport Authority (LTA) are spending about S\$500 million to overhaul older trains (31)_____ the North-South and East-West lines by 2016. This will include upgrading the signalling system by 2018.

SBS Transit, (32)_____ other rail operator, is also improving its network. It is replacing problematic parts of the North-East Line overhead power system, and doing (33)_____ upgrade of major systems of its 10-year-old trains. The improvements made (34)_____ both operators have led to fewer delays that exceed five minutes. The number of delays fell from 396 in 2012 (35)_____ 309 last year.

"Fewer trains (36)_____ also being withdrawn from service on all lines," Mr Lui added. "We have made some strides in the right direction, but there is certainly room (37)_____ improvement." He also said SMRT is changing (38)_____ approach in dealing with breakdowns. Instead of having a generic plan for stretches of rail, it will have a station-by-station contingency plan.

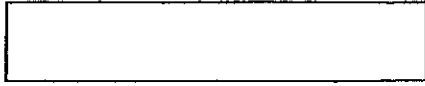

In 1934, when I was about four years old and living in Kenya, my parents returned from a business trip to Nairobi with two small lion cubs. The pair, a male named Sultan and a female named Sanya, had been neglected by their sick mother in the capital city's zoo. They arrived at my home, a small farm, hissing and spitting. Then they tottered round my garden on their short legs.

It did not take long before they had both settled in as our dog, Bonzo, got along well with them. However, at feeding time, Bonzo had to be shut away to stop him from stealing their food. The cubs would spend the night in the bathroom. The next morning, when the cook came to bring us our breakfast, they would push their way into our bedrooms. I would feed the cubs with my leftovers and then they would lie on our chairs. The cubs were friendly towards my family as well as our friends.

However, my mother's friend, Aunt Sophia, from South Africa, had a different experience when she came to visit us one day. After numerous cups of tea, she had to answer the call of nature. When she entered the toilet, a cub's head appeared at one end of the bath and another appeared at the opposite end. The poor woman screamed, opened the door immediately and fled. To her horror, the fascinated lions followed her. She became so hysterical that she took the earliest train home.

The cubs scared some of my neighbours too. When the cubs grew much bigger, they had to be locked away at night in a cage. This pleased some of the neighbouring farmers, who had complained about the possible danger of our "wild lions" to their lives and their animals.

To me, the cubs were never a danger to them or my family. In fact, I often played games with Sultan and Sanya. I loved being dragged round the garden on the end of their tails. On one occasion, when I was five years old, my mother was playing a game of 'Peekaboo' with me on the couch. She hid her head in a cushion and then popped up to say "Boo!". Sultan decided to join in and at one point when my mother lifted her head, I had disappeared. Mother looked over just in time to see my feet at the door – my head in Sultan's mouth. Mum dashed over and stopped him. He let me go and licked me. However, he got a spanking from Mum for his trouble. This must have made Sultan very upset as he was locked up for a week after that incident.

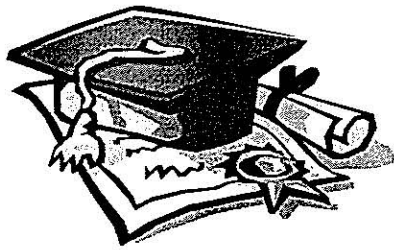
