Under ideal conditions, the egg of an Aedes mosquito can hatch into a larva in less than a day. The larva then takes about four days to develop into a pupa, (16) from which an adult mosquito will appear after two days. Three days after the mosquito has bitten a person and taken in blood, it will lay eggs. Then, the cycle begins again.

Only the female Aedes mosquito bites as it needs the protein in blood to develop its eggs. The mosquito becomes infectious approximately seven days (17) after it has bitten a person carrying the virus. This is the incubation period, during which the virus multiplies in the mosquito.

Mosquitoes are most active at dawn and dusk. The average lifespan of an Aedes mosquito in nature is two weeks. The mosquito can lay eggs about three times in its lifetime, and about a hundred eggs are produced each time.

The eggs can lie <u>dormant</u> in dry conditions for up to about nine months.

PEOPLE & LANGUAGE

Due to the relative isolation of the island, the people of Jeju Island have developed a culture and language that is distinct from those of mainland Korea. It is a magical place known for 3 things: roaring winds, magnificent rocks and women since there is a bigger population of women.

'Sea' Women of Jeju Island

For hundreds of years, many women in Jeju Island have made their living through harvesting seafood by hand from the ocean floor. The 'sea' women do not use any breathing equipment although a typical dive inight last around two minutes!

GEOGRAPHY

The island was created entirely from volcanic eruptions approximately 2 million years ago.

A central feature of Jeju is Hallasan, the tallest mountain in South Korea and a dormant volcano. The peak of the mountain looks like a giant crater. There are 360 other smaller volcanoes around the main volcano.

NATURE AND WILDLIFE

Jeju Island is a popular honeymoon destination for Korean newlyweds. It has beautiful beaches and waterfalls that take one's breath away. It is a tropical paradise.

FOOD

Jeju Island is famous for its abundance of saltwater seafood, in particular its abalone. Thus, local dishes are mainly made with seafood, vegetables and seaweed.

Highly popular, Formula One (F1) racing is a motor sport in which drivers race each other in super-fast cars. Michael Schumacher was an F1 racer for nineteen years until he retired in 2012. He won the world championship seven times - a feat no one else has achieved.

Schumacher came from a poor family. His father did not earn much money from his job as a *bricklayer. It was not easy for Schumacher's family to make ends meet. But Schumacher's incredible strength and determination made it possible for him to rise to become the most successful driver in F1 history. He did this through sheer hard work and self-discipline. His competitors admired him for his single-minded determination to overcome obstacles.

Unfortunately, some years after his retirement, Schumacher was involved in an accident. He was skiing with his son and some friends in France. Skiing is a sport in which people slide down snow-covered mountain slopes by using a pair of long, narrow strips called skis that they wear on their feet.

Schumacher was a professional skier. He was also a very careful skier. In spite of that, he crashed into a partially hidden rock. The impact flung him against another rock. He hit his head so hard that his helmet split into two pieces. He was immediately taken to a hospital.

Doctors found that his brain was damaged and terribly swollen as a result of the blow to his head. There were big blood clots in his brain, causing him to go into a coma. Doctors tried very hard to remove them. Meanwhile, his family and friends hoped that the former F1 champion would demonstrate the same grit and determination he had shown in winning F1 races to pull through and wake up.

After some months, Schumacher made progress and finally regained consciousness. He is currently paralysed and needs to re-learn basic skills like walking, talking and remembering simple things. Compared to how he

had lived his life on the fast lanes of F1 where he could do everything accurately and quickly, this must be extremely difficult and frustrating for him.

The accident has taken a great toll on Schumacher's family. His wife, Corinna, has reportedly taken over her husband's 500 million dollar business empire as he is unable to manage his business while he receives treatment for his injuries.

Corinna Schumacher has sold their 25 million dollar jet and holiday home as she believes he will 'never fully recover to enjoy them again' after the life-changing skiing accident in the French Alps in 2013. She is also considering selling their winter home there, where the accident took place. To her, it is a painful reminder of the tragedy that occurred. A report in a German newspaper said, 'Corinna is now alone, alone in a golden empire.'

Schumacher requires round the clock care at his mansion in Gland, Switzerland. Recently, his doctors said that the 46-year-old has made little progress as he is immobile and cannot speak.

A well-loved personality known by many from all walks of life and around the world, Schumacher will have to summon every ounce of his courage and fighting spirit to go right back to the starting line of an entirely different race - that of a long, slow and hard recovery.

'I never thought I was the best or unbeatable,' Schumacher once said in an interview. Perhaps that was what kept him unbeatable in F1 racing for many years. According to the official F1 website, he is 'statistically the greatest driver the sport has ever seen'.
