WHAT IS BULLYING?

Bullying is a situation where a person intentionally harms a vulnerable and isolated victim through repeated hurtful behaviours that can result in damaging consequences. Bullying can be verbal, physical or relational.

Direct bullying usually is seen and felt readily. Indirect bullying (deliberate exclusion, name calling, etc.) is much more difficult to identify. It is comparatively more difficult to remedy, and should be clearly seen as different from direct bullying.

Talk to a trusted friend or adult!


Stand up for yourself!

WHY STOP BULLYING?

- Victims grow socially insecure and anxious with decreased selfesteem.
- Bullying in school interferes with learning inschool and may lead to increased absenteeism and dropout rates.
- Constant fear of the bully results in physical ill -health symptoms such as headaches.
- The longer bullying lasts, the harder it is to change.
- Bullying children may become bullying adults.
- Bullying may result in continued aggressive behaviour in adulthood.
