Interesting Discoveries Made by an Animal Trainer

Do you know your pets well? Do you know what it means when they make certain sounds or behave in certain ways? Animal trainer, Thomas Chia, has had pets all his life and is convinced that we can gain some insight into how animals think by studying their way of playing. Dogs are of particular interest to him. Unlike most other animals, these canines continue playing throughout their lives, regardless of age, and that naturally makes them the best choice for his research.

Dogs wag their tails a little more to the right when they see their owners or something that appeals to them, and a little more to the left when they see non-threatening strangers and surroundings that are new to them.

Dogs do not just bark! They also make sounds like growling, grunting, yelping, and howling to communicate.



Dogs bend down on their front legs to invite other dogs to play. They usually stick their tails up in the air at the same time!

When the opportunity for you to spend some time with dogs comes up, see if Thomas' deductions can help you understand them better!

What do animal trainers do?

- ★ interact with the animals to help them get used to human voice and contact
- * teach the animals to respond appropriately to different cues
- * ensure that the animals eat a proper diet and get adequate exercise
- * monitor the animals' health and physical condition in order to recommend medical care when necessary
- customise the training programmes to suit the animals' moods, capabilities and mastery of skills
