The Olympic Games is an international sports competition that takes place once every four years. Countries from all over the world send participants to take part in various sporting events. According to historical records, the first ancient Olympic Games can be traced back to 776 BC. They were dedicated to the Olympian gods and were staged on the ancient plains of Olympia. In 1896, the first modern games took place in Athens. The next Olympic Games, in 2012, will be held in London, England. London has previously hosted this competition in 1908 and 1948.

The Olympics is very important as it brings together athletes from different countries around the world. As all the athletes live together in a place called the 'Olympic Village' during the competition, most of these athletes befriend competitors from other countries during their stay. In addition, staying in close proximity to their training venues allows them to minimise their travelling time.

This is to ensure that they stay in tip-top condition for their training sessions. When an athlete wins a medal in any of the games, he or she will gain worldwide recognition. This is because people all over the world watch the Olympics on the television or read about it in the newspapers and would come to know about the winners. This media exposure of the Games also constitutes a major opportunity for the host city and country to showcase itself to the world.
