

A message from the organisers...

Today, we use many different devices to go online to keep in touch with friends and family, take pictures, do our homework, do research, find out the latest news, and even shop. However, are you aware of the dangers lurking online? Here are two true stories taken from the news recently...

"14 year-old boy" was actually adult male in mid-40s

"He told me during our online chat that he was 14 and studied at a school next to mine. He knew the school I studied in because he had seen my school name on my personal profile. We had chatted online for six months before we arranged to meet at the nearby MRT station. When this middle-aged man approached me and called my name, I got a shock. He asked me to join him for a drink at MacDonalds but I refused and ran off. Luckily, a teacher from my school was on her way home and I ran to her and told her what had happened. The man ran off when my teacher walked towards him. I didn't expect him to lie to me as he seemed very nice online. -"Laura", 12 (not her real name)

"She knew so much about me it was scary! Then I realised..."

"This pretty lady approached me after my CCA and called my name. I had never met her before but she seemed rather nice. She claimed to be a distant relative who lived in Malaysia. We even had the same surname! She asked me how the different members of my family were and even asked about my pet dog. She then offered to send me home. She was so nice that I accepted until I saw a man in the driver's seat of the car she led me to. I felt uncomfortable and quickly came up with an excuse and walked away. When I got home, I realised that all the things the lady had spoken to me about were things I had posted online "Jane", 12 (not her real name)

These are just two of many similar encounters with online predators. Thankfully, 'Laura' and 'Jane' managed to get out of the situation and stayed safe. But others may not be so fortunate.

17-year-old Ashley Yong saved up for her senior prom* but, ultimately used the money on something else entirely. Instead, the Chicago teen spent the money she saved up for one glamorous night on things that would make a lasting difference for the homeless people in her community. After seeing how much difference the money she saved could make, she now has even bigger plans in the works to help even more people!

Ashley knew that her father was not going to pay for her prom since he had always frowned on such events which he described as extravagant. Besides, her family was not very well-to-do and the money could be used for more meaningful things. Ashley had always borne a grudge and lamented about how 10 unfortunate she was to be in such a position. However, she was determined to go to the prom and began saving on her own for the high-cost event that, on average, costs prom-goers in the United States about a thousand dollars. But after spending hours online looking for hair, makeup, and dress ideas, she had a revelation - "After a while, I realised that I was too consumed in figuring out how 15 to make one night the best night of my life."

So Ashley took a look at those less fortunate around her, and realised that her savings could make a big difference for homeless people in her community. She spent nearly all of her savings on items like socks, food and toothbrushes, packed them in boxes, and distributed them in person the evening after the 20 prom. Ashley said that she was initially sad seeing pictures of her friends at the prom without her, but seeing the looks on people's faces as they opened her boxes of donations changed everything. "Their smiles said it all, and my heart burst with happiness. It was the best night of my life!" Ashley recalled. "As my dad and I drove away from the children excitedly rummaging through the boxes, 25 I started crying. I told my dad I could not believe how blessed we really were."

Although most of her classmates were supportive, a few were critical, arguing that she did it for attention. Ashley's response was that they were right she did do it for attention but not for herself. She filmed her project because she wanted to raise awareness of local homelessness and show people how easy it 30 was to help. "I'm a high schooler with no job, car or really anything I own to sustain myself. Giving isn't hard, and it most definitely is not impossible," she observed. She then added, "I might not have had the opportunity to dress myself up nor have any memories of the prom but I know that I've helped others and that has made me a better person. And I want to do more!"

Ashley now plans to repeat her efforts on a larger scale, using funds from an online campaign, which has already raised over \$1,400. She also hopes in future to create a non-profit group dedicated to helping homeless people. She said, "It is the experiences you gain when you volunteer actively and meet different people that make you a better person. I hope that more people will 40 get involved but not by just putting money into a cup."
