The SCDF officers wheeled him to the ambulance after they had dimmed the rescue lights. Corporal Ahmad felt relieved. The SCDF officers needed sleep urgently. Instead, they had a quick meal. After that, for the next three days, Corporal Ahmad had very little sleep as he searched for survivors while the construction crew cleared the rubble.

Although they found more survivors, there were also some who did not survive. Corporal Ahmad received a promotion for his courage and perseverance. He was also awarded a Public Service Star but he said, "I was just doing my job." He mentioned that the details of the tragedy were etched in his mind.
