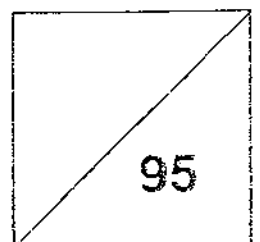



They play an important role in maintaining the balance of nature. Their preferred foods are rats, gophers and other small rodents. Without coyotes to keep their numbers down, these rodents would do enormous damage to the crops. 20

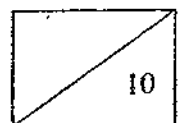

Upon hearing that, Zen, our eldest cousin, wanted to jump into the water to get Lily. However, my parents concerned for his safety, stopped him. We were fortunate that two teenagers responded to the emergency. They swam towards Lily while we watched with anxiety. Was it just a coincidence 20  
that the ball and my struggling sister came into my sight? Perhaps not. Till today, I feel that the ball had been deliberately guided in its speed and flight path to ensure my sister's rescue. I believe **an angel was watching over Lily** that day.

Lily was almost going under by the time the two teenagers rescued her. 25  
Back to shore, she shivered and coughed violently as she had swallowed a lot of seawater. We hovered over her, comforting her as she started whimpering in fear. She held onto my mother and refused to let go. Eventually, she tired herself out crying.

On the next few trips we made to the beach, Lily refused to go 30  
anywhere near the water. No matter how we coaxed her or tried to bribe her  
with sweets, she was adamant. While she sat by my parents and occupied  
herself with building sandcastles, my siblings and I would play in the sea.  
Fortunately, Lily's fear did not get the better of her - she could not resist having  
fun. After we promised to keep an eye on her, she decided to join in the fun, 35  
frolicking in the water and playing beach ball. Gradually, she was comfortable  
enough to play on her own again.

The incident turned out to be a **blessing in disguise**. It prompted Lily  
to take her swimming lessons later on in primary school very seriously. My  
sister is now an excellent swimmer and she represents her school at national 40  
competitions. When reminded of the incident, she would deny with a cheeky  
grin that it had ever happened.
