In high school, Ware was the most renowned troublemaker in his town. Teachers literally cringed when they saw his name on their class lists. He was neither talkative nor disruptive in class but would always land up in fights. He practically failed all his subjects.

I met Ware for the first time at a school leadership programme that was conducted during the summer holidays. It was targeted at making youths become more involved in their communities. Ware was among the 405 participants. Initially, he was standing by the side, refusing to participate in the programme. Gradually, the interactive games drew him in. The ice melted and he started to contribute ideas to the discussions. The other participants were receptive to them and everyone was listening to him. He was treated as part of the group and was selected as the leader. Ware proved to be a smart guy with great ideas.

Ware participated actively in all the discussions. By the end of the two-month holiday programme, he had joined the Homeless Project team. He could empathise with the homeless as he knew something about poverty, hunger and hopelessness. The other pupils in his group looked up to him for his passionate concern and ideas. They even elected him as the Vice-Chairman of the team.

However, when Ware returned to school after the summer holidays, he arrived to a firestorm. Many teachers were strongly protesting against him being elected as the Vice-Chairman of such a massive project. They refused to believe in Ware and doubted his capability in organising a massive community-wide service project. However, the Principal refused to listen to them. The teachers left the meeting shaking their heads in disgust, firmly believing that failure was imminent.

Two weeks later, Ware and his friends led a group of 70 pupils in a drive to collect food for the Homeless Project. The local newspaper reported on the event and it was posted on the main bulletin board in school where everyone could read. Ware's photograph was posted on the front page of the newspaper.

The tumour had mushroomed. There was a high chance that Ben's liver might tear and bleed. In addition to that, Pam and her husband were experiencing some financial hardship and were struggling to pay for Ben's medical expenses. Pam and her husband were caught in a dilemma. Both of them were torn between caring for Ben after surgery and going to work to support themselves. They chose to care for Ben instead. People would rarely go to that expense for an old dog. Ben survived the surgery miraculously. Another miracle happened a year later. Pam was pregnant!

She gave the baby's blanket to Ben so that he would become comfortable with the new scent. Whenever the baby cried, Ben would raise his head to make sure that either Pam or her husband was around.

One morning, Joseph was in his crib while Pam was busy in the kitchen. Troy was reading the newspapers in the living room. Suddenly, Ben went behind Pam and kept barking, jumping and hopping. Initially, she ignored him but he grew more and more frantic in his attempts to coax her into following him to the bedroom. He was behaving abnormally.

When she got into the bedroom, she gasped in horror as the baby's skin had become a shade of blue. His body had grown limp. Pam was scared out of her wits. Pam and Troy immediately rushed the baby to the hospital.

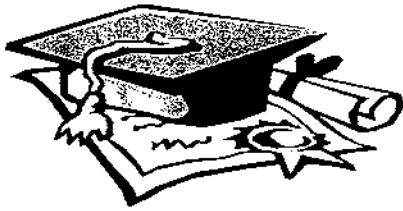
