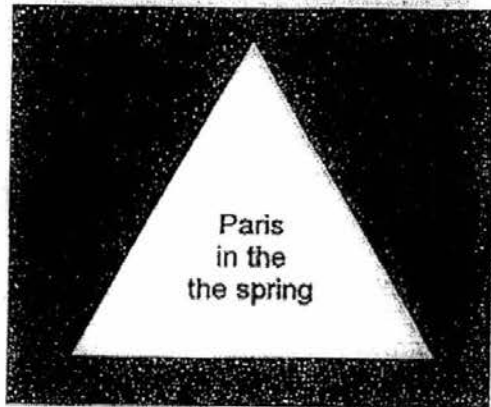

A long time ago, giants ruled the Solomon Islands. On one of these islands lived a widow, Tatau, and her two sons, Joe and Roy. One morning, they heard horns being blown by the villagers, followed by the sound of beating drums. This signified that there were large schools of tuna in the sea in front of them. Joe and Roy knew that it was a good chance to bring in this much-prized catch. Soon, they were placing the hooks and fishing lines in their canoe. They climbed aboard and paddled their way out to join the rest of the fishermen. Tatau stayed at home and went about her normal daily morning chores. 5

While the brothers were catching tuna, Joe heard his mother screaming for help. He told Roy to stay quiet for a moment. Since they heard no other sound, they went back to their fishing. Moments later, they both heard their dog at home barking non-stop. Both brothers knew that something was wrong. They quickly paddled back to shore. They ran to the house while calling out for their mother. However, all they found was their dog helplessly growling. Tatau was nowhere to be seen. The boys knew something terrible had happened to their mother. 10 15

Joe and Roy searched the house and found giant footprints. They quickly deduced that a giant had taken their mother. Giant abductions were common in other villages from time to time. Gathering their bags, axes and spears with their dog following the scent of the giant's trail, they set out in the hope that their mother might still be alive. 20

With no clear plan of what they would do if they did catch up with the giant, Joe and Roy reached a river's edge. It was apparent to them that the giant was following the river towards the mountains. The coastal people believed that it was dangerous to go to these mountains which were known to be giant territory. If someone did venture there, it was quite likely that they would not return. However, with the obvious giant footprints to follow and their dog still on the scent, they followed the giant's trail along the river's edge for some kilometres. This was a good sign that their mother might still be alive, as there was no evidence that the giant had stopped anywhere to make a meal out of her. 25

At the foothills of the big mountains, the brothers were fully aware that they could not call out for their mother as this would possibly alert the giant. Their dog sniffed and dug madly under a boulder, which appeared to be the entrance to some sort of cave. With their dog relentlessly digging away at the soil, Tatau's sons guessed that their mother was behind it. The brothers tried to roll the huge stone to the side but found it far too heavy to move. With their bare hands and axes, they began digging away at the soil to loosen the rock. 30 35

The giant had temporarily placed Tatau behind that boulder so that he could gather some taro leaves, which these beasts liked eating. He also needed to collect some firewood to build a fire and keep himself warm at night. Joe forced his hand through a small opening which they had made, hoping to find his mother. Tatau grabbed it tightly, much to the brothers' relief. Fully aware that the giant might return at any time, the boys dug frantically, to widen the hole enough to get their mother out. 40
