The Oasis Gardens receives nearly two million visitors each year, making it one of the city's most popular attractions! The relatively predictable weather - warm temperature and regular rainfall - supports thousands of exotic plants gathered from around the world, enabling us to enjoy them all year round. You will see trees that are some of the largest of their kind, rare species of plants that are only found here, and plants that were cultivated to mark special occasions.

① Information Centre

On arriving at Oasis Gardens, you can help yourselves to brochures, maps and fact sheets at no extra cost before you embark on your self-guided tour. A souvenir shop and cafe are also conveniently located here. You can purchase a memento of your visit and refresh yourself with a snack and drink before departing from Oasis Gardens.

② Friendship Arch

This was presented by the Friendship Arch Organisation to the city in 2002. It went on display in various famous places for two years. It is made of tokens of goodwill from more than 100 countries in recognition of the city's efforts to establish harmonious relations with them. There are fewer than 20 such arches around the world, and it has been an iconic feature of Oasis Gardens since 2004.

③ Gardeners' Cabin

In the olden days, staff used to have their meals and get some rest here. After it was refurbished in 2012, it became an ideal venue for weddings and dinner parties. It is only accessible to visitors who book it for private events.

④ Meteorological Station

Staff are rostered to record data on rainfall, wind direction and speed, cloud cover, and other weather conditions at hourly intervals throughout the day. The information is made available to the public at www.ogardens.sg. Only authorised personnel may enter the station. Visitors who wish to learn about the station may pick up a brochure on it in the Information Centre.

On hearing the ringing of his alarm clock, Tony jumped out of bed immediately. As the founder of Willing Hearts, he would always strive to be a good example for his volunteers. Punctually at 4 a.m. every day, Tony would reach Telok Kurau to work alongside his volunteers. Before stepping into the huge kitchen, he would don his hairnet, apron and gloves. This was the standard hygiene practice for all the volunteers at Willing Hearts, Singapore's largest food kitchen that distributed free food to the needy. 5

Working like a well-oiled machine, Tony and his crew of volunteers engaged in a flurry of activities – from washing rice, chopping vegetables to cooking the various dishes. Next, they lined the lunch boxes, scooped a portion of rice along with the dishes, closed and put them into the delivery basket. However, the day was not over for Tony. He worked tirelessly with the second crew of volunteers for the next task. They cleaned the kitchen before washing all the trays and cooking utensils that were used to prepare the food. 10

Just as he was about to take a short break, he heard one of the volunteers shout, "Tony, one of our drivers is sick and can't deliver the food!" Immediately, Tony grabbed the car keys. As he was getting into the car to make the delivery, he received a call informing him that he had won the World Peace Award, the Asian equivalent of the Nobel Prize. 15

Startled that he was a recipient of this award, Tony recalled how he had embarked on his charitable work. Having lived from hand to mouth after his father left when he was five, he was no stranger to poverty. His mother barely earned enough money with the odd jobs that she took on. Despite their situation, she still gave what she could to those in need. However, she never compelled her son to do the same. Tony recalled, "I was too busy building my career and pursuing my interest in boating at that time." For him, the turning point came at his mother's funeral where he was inspired by how she had lived her life. He gazed in amazement at the number of people who had come to pay their respects as his mother had helped them and been their friend in need. 20 25

He decided to continue his mother's legacy. Thus, when one of his mother's friends asked, "Tony, can you take over your mother's role to collect unsold bread from a bakery for the orphanage?", he wholeheartedly said, "Yes." Tony gathered around a hundred pieces of bread, but the children only needed thirty. Not wanting the bread to go to waste, Tony distributed them to the elderly and foreign workers. In the following days, another of his mother's friend asked Tony, "Can you collect extra vegetables from the wholesalers?" Knowing what his mother would say, he replied, "Yes" with determination. Just like before, Tony collected more vegetables than needed and distributed them to the needy. 30

One day, his wife asked, "Tony, do you want to cook for the elderly who cannot cook for themselves?" Obliging, Tony said, "Yes." This started his journey of providing cooked meals for the needy. Along the way, he recalled asking his friends for help and without hesitation, many said "yes". Tony realised that Willing Hearts started with one word – "yes". To him, it shows an eagerness to help others. This inspired him to name his organisation "Willing Hearts" as he felt that nothing would be impossible with a willing heart. 35

As the volunteers finished loading all the packed meals, they slammed the car door. That jolted Tony out of his thoughts. He quickly drove off to deliver the meals. Despite feeling honoured by the award, he knew who the 'real heroes' were. Without them, Willing Hearts would not be able to provide more than 9,000 meals a day to the needy. 40

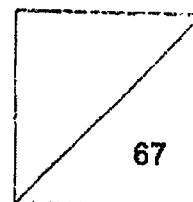
