



Over thirty years of camping vacations, Jack had never experienced or heard of a wolf attack. This changed last June while he was camping with his wife and two sons at Banff National Park. Jack and his family had always wanted to camp there as it was well known for its scenic view and tranquillity. However, there were also reports of sightings of wolves. Signs about them had been put up around the campsites to advise campers to stay vigilant especially at night. Yet, Jack and his family decided to go ahead with the long-awaited summer camping vacation. Everything went as planned and the family had a whale of a time. They also made friends with another man named Matt who was camping alone at the next campsite. Night fell. At around midnight, Jack awoke to the sound of a panicked voice calling for help. Sensing trouble, he decided to investigate at the next campsite.

As Jack approached the other campsite, he caught sight of an animal's rear legs protruding from a collapsed tent. The legs were too large to belong to a dog. Matt shouted and that startled the animal which backed out of the tent. Suddenly, Jack was standing face to face with a wolf. "That was a terrifying moment," he recalled. Matt jumped out of the collapsed tent covered in blood. Moments earlier, the wolf had ripped through the tent, puncturing his arm and tearing part of the tent. Jack threw rocks at the wolf to scare it away. However, the wolf bared its teeth with its ears pointed, all ready to attack Jack. Jack was horrified but quickly regained his composure. He recalled what he had read from a newspaper article some time ago. If one were to be confronted by a wolf, the person should use fire to scare the wolf off. Instantaneously, Jack picked up a fire stick from the campfire and waved it frantically at the wolf. The wolf backed off and ran back into the woods.

Jack immediately helped Matt into his van and drove him to the nearest hospital 24 to receive treatment. Matt, who received twenty stitches to close his wound, was truly grateful to Jack. Later that night, a few park rangers caught the wolf. The park rangers shared that such wolf attacks were so rare one had a greater chance of being killed by a dog, lightning, a bee sting, or a car collision with a deer than being injured by a wolf. However, some wolves simply had no fear for humans especially since some were feeding the wolves at campsites.

Thankfully, after months of recuperation, Matt's wounds finally healed completely. Jack, whom Matt regarded as his guardian angel, still kept in touch with him over social media. The two men even exchanged Christmas gifts. In an interview. Jack admitted to a fleeting thought during the heat of battle. The moment the wolf had locked eyes with him, Jack thought, "Why am I here and what if I die?"

"It is rare for a PMD battery to catch fire when it is not in use," commented another expert. To elemenate such accidents, PMDs must meet safety standards imposed by the gahvenment A certified PMD is fitted with sensor tecnologi. It shuts down the PMD once it detects that the battery has been overheated.
